First Two Churches

Church One: Ephesus (Desired One) – Lost First Love

Church Two: Smyrna (Myrrh): suffering/death persecuted church

First Two Churches

Church One: Ephesus Repent/Return – Eat Tree of Life

Church Two: Smyrna No Condemnation - -no 2nd death

First Two Churches

Ephesus: Apostolic Church (A.D. 33-100)

Smyrna: the Persecuted Church (A.D 100 – 313)

Revelation Review

Ephesus: good on doctrine, good on works BUT lost their "first love" (worship not just works) Smyrna: 'myrrh' (death) – nothing negative said about them. The church closest to Jesus is suffering Pergamos: City of the serpent

Ephesus: great <u>political</u> center Smyrna: great <u>commercial</u> center Pergamum: great <u>religious</u> center

Third Church

Pergamos: Church Joined to the World (A.D. 314-590)

12 "And to the angel of the church in Pergamum write:

Per: mixed/objectionable Magos: marriage (spiritual harlotry)

ALSO: 'pergo' (from the word <u>Pergamos</u>), means <u>the heights</u> (Satan's throne)

The City of Pergamos

Satan loves the high places – trying to counterfeit the Lord God (Psalm 78:69) Took Jesus to a high mountain to show Him all the kingdoms of the Earth (Matt. 4:8) Tried to ascend to "the heights" of God's throne (Isaiah 14:13) Corrupted Israel with the "high places" (Psalm 78:58)

Pagan Influences

Altar of Zeus, the father of the gods (Satan) Shrines of Apollo the sun-god, Aphrodite (goddess of love), Aesculapius the god of medicine, Cybele the Phrygian nature goddess.

At the Agora were statues of Poseidon the sea-god, and Demeter the goddess of corn.

The City of Pergamos

Modern city in Turkey = 'Bergama' Pop. 50,000 – ancient times 200,000

The City of Pergamos

Lower city

Temple of Aesculapius, the god of healing – had the power over death (Satan's lie – you surely shall not die) counterfeited by Satan from Numbers 21 (2 Kgs 18:3-4; John 3:14-15)





CADUCEUS VS. ROD OF ASCLEPIUS



The Caduceus is the traditional emblem of the Greek god Hermes, messenger to the gods (equivalent to Roman Mercury). He is the patron of thieves, merchants and travelers.

The Caduceus features two snakes entwined around a staff with wings.

The symbol represents Hermes, fertility, rebirth, rejuvenation, harmony and balance.



The Rod of Asclepius is the symbol of Asclepius, the Greco-Roman god of healing and medicine.

This is the correct symbol of medicine, featuring a single snake wrapped around a staff.

The staff may symbolize authority and the snake symbolizes rebirth, healing and rejuvenation.

high places and broke the pillars and cut down the Asherah. And he broke in pieces the bronze serpent that Moses had made, for until those days the people of Israel had made offerings to it (it was called Nehushtan).

John 3:14-15

And as Moses lifted up the serpent in the wilderness, so must the Son of Man be lifted up, that whoever believes in him may have eternal life.

The City of Pergamos

Lower city Spring-fed bathes for healing (water of life – inhabitants constantly pursued health) Luxurious and indulgent city "Wealth is useless without your health" (Bill Gates)

The City of Pergamos <u>Upper City</u> – 4 Temples on top Zeus – the chief god (Satan) Athena – (Athens) Zeus daughter; goddess of wisdom, war. Dionysus: goddess of wine, fertility, religious ecstasy.

The City of Pergamos

<u>Upper City</u> – 4 Temples

(4) Temple for Emperor worship

The Church of Pergamos

Church that is mixed with the world (the compromise of truth). Ephesus had lost it's first love, Smyrna suffered from internal and external persecution – yet both

churches maintained their doctrinal integrity and lived it out. Pergamos is different: corrupted internally by false teaching. (compromised w/ the world's values).

False Teaching in the Church Today

•Evolution (you are your own god, doubting God's Word from Gen. 1 and following) •Hyper-grace: Don't condemn sin – It's offensive/legalistic (Lk 17:3; 1 Tim. 5:20) •Ecumenical Movement: Unity is more important than doctrine (2 Tim. 4:3-4)

False Teaching in the Church Today

•Social Gospel: we should work with anyone "profamily" or "pro-life" (2 Cor. 6:14-17) •Headship: Female Pastors/teachers over men [not enough men] (1 Tim. 2:12; 1 Tim. 3:2) •Prosperity Gospel: God wants his children to be financially prosperous (Mt. 6:19-20; 8:20; Lk 18:22). If you have enough faith God will give you whatever you ask (James 4:3; 1 Jn. 5:14)

False Teaching in the Church Today

•Syncretism: Mormons, Jehovah's Witnesses, 7th Day Adventists, Roman Catholics - the belief that all these are members of legitimate Christian churches. (Rev. 22:18) •Universal reconciliation, scripture/relevant, no hell, deification man, planet-worship

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The Sharp Two-Edged Sword

Eph 6:17 - "the Word of God" Gen. 1:3 - God created all life and all matter with the spoken word Gen. 11:7 - The word (language) was used by God as judgment at Babel (confusion)

Sharp Two-Edged Sword

Isaiah 49:2 – He made my mouth like a sharp sword; in the shadow of his hand he hid me; he made me a polished arrow; in his quiver he hid me away.

Sharp Two-Edged Sword

John 1:1-3 – Jesus Christ - the living Word

Hebrews 4:12 – Living/active

Two-Edged Sword

His Word Stands Forever:

(Matthew 24:35; 1 Peter 1:25; Isaiah 40:8)

The symbol of the Roman proconsul was a sword (peace thru strength)

It's more important God's people fear (respect) <u>His</u> sword rather than <u>man's</u>

(1) Babylon: Nimrod – first worlddictator (Bab-el: Mystery Religions –Rev. 17)

When Cyrus conquered Babylon the priests of the "Mystery Religion" migrated

(2) Tyre: Ezekiel 28:11-19 (some of the strongest prophetic condemnations in Bible for Pride, sexual sins, idolatry)

(3) Pergamos: Revelation 2:13

(4) Later migrates to Rome(5) Berlin, Germany

Where is his throne now?

It will return to **Babylon** in the tribulation (Zechariah 5:5-11)

Satan is called the "god of this world" (2 Cor. 4:4),

"prince of this world" (Ephesians 2:2), and

the "ruler of this world" (John 12:31).

Demons are not omnipresent. They have locality, areas of responsibility, rank in power.

Demons confined to river Euphrates Daniel 10 – they are territorial Job – under restriction - accountability Demoniac at Gadara



Altar of Pergamos


The altar is 125 ft. by 115 ft. and is 50 feet tall. Altar of Zeus, one of the seven wonders of the ancient world. Located 800 feet above the plain and towered over the 'lower' city of Pergamos.

Currently in Museum Island in Berlin: Discovered in Turkey by the German archaeologist Carl Humann circa 1880. Adolf Hitler ordered it taken down brick by brick and moved to Berlin in the 1930's.





The Pergamon altar served as the inspiration of Albert Speer for the Nuremberg stadium used by Adolf Hitler and the Nazis. It also served as part of the design for Vladimir Lenin's tomb in Red Square.



Barrack Obama was so impressed by the altar when he visited Germany that he had a copy made for his DNC Acceptance Speech in 2008 in Denver, Co. (Barrack Obama/Joe Biden).



Satan's Throne

President Erdogan in Turkey wants it back – the Christians in Berlin continually pray he gets it back. (I don't believe his throne resides in Berlin any longer however.)

Who is Balaam

Not a Jew

 soothsayer – Joshua 13:22
 from Mesopotamia – Deut. 23:4-5
 from Euphrates (modern Iraq – Babylon) – Num. 22:5; 23:7

Balak – King of Moab, hires Balaam to come and curse Israel.

Teaching Balaam

Balaam asks God's permission – God says DON'T go Eventually goes – famous Balaam's donkey scene Refuses to curse Israel but tells Balak how to corrupt Israel (so God curses)

Teaching Balaam

1) the "doctrine" of Balaam": mixed marriage, sexual immorality (Rev. 2:14) 2) the "way" of Balaam: sold his gift for money (used God's gift for self) (2 Peter 2:15) 3) the "error" of Balaam: give up eternal treasure for temporary gain (Jude 11)

Nicolaitans

Rev. 2:6 – "works" of the Nicolaitans, now in Pergamos, "teaching" (doctrine) of the Nicolaitans.

Nicolaitans

This issue is a demonic structure within the church which actually creates barriers to God's people drawing closer to Him and growing in intimacy. It is a method of keeping people who desire a deeper spiritual relationship with God merely dependent on other human beings.

Who Are the Overcomers

<u>1 John 5:4-5 – "For whoever has been</u> born of God overcomes the world; and this is the victory that has overcome the world: our faith. Who is the one who overcomes the world, but the one who believes that Jesus is *the Son of God*?

Marks of a True Church Ephesus: Love for God, the brethren and the lost Smyrna: bearing up under persecution/suffering for His name Pergamum: separation from sin/false doctrine/the world

Ten historical periods of persecution under future Roman Emperors

- 54-68 Nero (Paul beheaded; Peter crucified upside-down)
 95-96 **Domitian (John exiled)**
- 104-117 Trajan (Ignatius burned at the stake)
- 161-180 Marcus Aurelius (Polycarp martyred)
- 200-211 Septimus Severus (killed Irenaeus)
- 235-237 Maximinus (killed Ursula and Hippolytus)
- 249-251 Decius
- 257-260 Valerian
- 270-275 Aurelian
- 303-313 Diocletian (Worst of all)

Ten historical periods of persecution under future Roman Emperors

313 AD – Constantine: Moved capital of empire from Rome to Byzantium (Constantinople/Istanbul). He issued Edict of Milan (religious toleration), ordered the Nicaea Council, worship on Sunday's, no work for slaves
