# Themes

Cain/Abel: the **two “seeds”**

**Cain**: seed of man-made religion

**Abel**: approach God via His standard

God becomes more & more distant

**Chapters 4-5: Two bloodlines**

# Why Study Genealogies

- **2 Timothy 3:16** – all scripture God-breathed
- Genealogies validate historical accuracy of Bible
- Confirm prophecy (Christ thru David's line)
- Prayer of Jabez within a genealogy
- Character Studies: Tamar (**incest**), Rahab (**prostitute**), Ruth (**Gentile**) in Messianic line



## Genesis lists nine specific *toledot*:

- 1 – Creation – Genesis 2:4
- 2 – **Adam** – Genesis 5:1 (**all humans**)
- 3 – Noah/his sons – Gen. 6:9;10:1,32 (**all nations**)
- 4 – Shem – Genesis 11:10
- 5 – Terah – 11:27 (**Abrahamic Line**)
- 6 – **Ishmael** – Gen. 25:12-13; 1 Chron. 1:29 (**split**)
- 7 – **Isaac** – Genesis 25:19
- 8 – **Esau** – Genesis 36:1, 9 (**Split**)
- 9 – **Jacob** – Genesis 37:2 (**Israel**)

# Genesis 5:1 – The “Book”

Now a “written history” – not just oral

God’s record orally transmitted to Adam: Ch. 1

Adam wrote: Chapters 2, 3, 4

Noah wrote: Chapters 5:1(b) – 6:9


# Human History

- ◆ First **2000 years** of human history (**Adam-Abraham**)  
God dealt with mankind (no “Jews” yet).
- ◆ Second **2000 years** (**Abraham to Christ**) God primarily dealing with the “chosen” people of Israel.
- ◆ Third **2000 years**: “**Church age**” God dealing with mankind once again through Word and His Spirit.

# Names Have Meaning

## Kevin

derived from the Irish Caoimhín,  
from the Gaelic word “caomh” meaning  
“kind” or “gracious”, “born of leadership”

A name given to nobility in Ireland

1<sup>st</sup> letter – Aleph (*Ab*):

'Ox' (strength, first)

# Ancient Hebrew - pictographic

2<sup>nd</sup> letter – *Beth*: 'house'



# Compound Word

Ab = strength, the first

Beth (ba') = house

**Abba**: first (head) of the house

**Father (daddy)**



# The Genealogy of Genesis 5

<b>Adam</b>	man	red, earthy
<b>Seth</b>	Appointed (wages of sin)	appointed
<b>Enosh</b>	Mortal (is death)	humanity
<b>Kenan</b>	sorrow, grief	possession
<b>Mahalalel</b>	The Blessed God	el = God, mahal = glory of
<b>Jared</b>	Shall come down	descent
<b>Enoch</b>	Teaching/instructing	initiated, dedicated

# The Genealogy of Genesis 5

<b>Methuselah</b>	His death shall bring	“man of a dart”
<b>Lamech</b>	The Despairing	“powerful/conqueror”
<b>Noah</b>	Comfort, Rest	“Sabbath”, “rest”


# Themes

# The “book” of the Genealogies

(only in Gen. 5 and Matthew 1:1)

**Matthew 1:1** – Matthew provides evidence of **the bloodline for Jesus** as the Mashiach Nagid (Messiah the King).



## Prove It!

**Ezra 2:62** – These people searched for their ancestral registrations, but they couldn't be located (returnees from the Babylonian captivity). Accordingly, they were assigned an "unclean" status and couldn't be priests.


(the wages of sin)

**Romans 6:23** – wages (earned) of sin is death [soul from body, soul from God (2 Thess. 1:9)]

## Two Bloodlines Contrasted

**Lamech:** (detailed in Gen. **Ch. 4**)

7<sup>th</sup> from Cain (same name: Noah's father)

**Enoch:** (detailed in Gen. **Ch. 5**)

7<sup>th</sup> from Adam. Same name: Cain's son

# Enoch

- ◆◆ A preacher (like Noah)
- ◆◆ A prophet (like Abel)
- ◆◆ Enoch never died (like Elijah)
- ◆◆ Removal before worldwide judgment (like the Church)



# Enoch

- ◆ **Enoch**: prophesied midway between **Adam & Abraham**
- ◆ **Elijah**: prophesied midway between **Abraham & Christ**

Jude 14-15 – first recorded prophecy by a man

It was also about these men that **Enoch**, in the seventh generation from Adam, prophesied, saying, “Behold, the Lord came with many thousands of His holy ones, to execute judgment upon all, and to convict all the **ungodly** of all their **ungodly** deeds which they have done in an **ungodly** way, and of all the harsh things which **ungodly** sinners have spoken against Him.”

## Hebrews 11:5-6

By faith Enoch was translated that he should not see death; and was not found, because God had translated him: for before his translation he had this testimony, that he **pleased God**. But without faith it is impossible to please him: for he that cometh to God must believe that **he is, and that he is a rewarder of them that diligently seek him.**



# Themes – “Walking with God”

Adam/Eve “walked” with God

Israel “walked” with God in the wilderness

The 12 disciples “walked” with God

Are we walking with God???

## Themes – “Walking with God”

**Daniel**: called the 'beloved prophet'

**John**: called the 'beloved disciple'

**John 14:21** – “He that hath my commandments, and keepeth them, he it is that loveth me: and he that loveth me shall be loved of my Father, and I will love him, and will manifest myself to him.”

# Themes – “Walking with God”

**James 4:8** - “draw near to God and He will draw near to you”

**Amos 3:3** – “how can two walk together unless they be agreed?”

**Luke 22:42** – “yet not my will, but thine be done”

**Proverbs 3:32** – His secret is with the upright
